Hello My Brethren,

You will be receiving your 2012 dues notice very soon. Let me bring to your attention a couple of issues that I see every year as Secretary concerning dues cards (also known as a rant).

First, I mail out approximately 175 cards, that's \$77.00 in postage and about four hours of sorting, stuffing and stamping. To those that respond quickly with their payment, THANK YOU!
