FROM THE GRAND MASTER

Grand Master's Discourse

Ignorance is an epidemic.

Dear Brothers,

As the year progresses and the Official Visits of the District Deputy Grand Masters continue to come in and we speak to the Worshipful Masters about the State of their Lodges, one theme continues to ring true through the conversations. This can be interpreted in two ways of which neither is good for our Fraternity. These two ways are: One, the fact that the Brothers are ignorant of their duties, and two that they are using ignorance as an excuse. I have pondered on this information for months and based on the evidence obtained I have come to the determination that it is not an excuse, it is far worse, it is an epidemic.

We are on the third year of the District Deputy Grand Master's reports and we still are working from the point of education as we discuss the information with the Worshipful Masters, whether in person or by phone, we hear this silence or see this blank look when some of the items are brought to their attention. It is really amazing that going into the third year with this program as well as the third year of the Masonic Leadership Training and yet we have so many Worshipful Masters not aware of their responsibilities. It seems that in our Lodges we have this concept that one man is elected for one year and this system is so deeply rooted in our DNA that to do otherwise is sometimes looked at as a dishonor for the Lodge to elect a Past Master or keep the Master for an additional year. Yet the downside to this situation that no one seems to mind is that we have Worshipful Masters in our Lodges with anywhere from 6 months as a Master Mason to 3 years tops becoming Masters of Lodges, with no experience in Masonry much less the requirements

of a Master and the worst case is that they do what they have seen in the short time they have been a member and think they know or understand what they are getting into. And even worse yet, they seek no help no counsel and in many cases those that may be there to assist are also not well informed.

My brothers, if this Institution is truly a Band of Brothers, we must act like one. We need to pool our resources and use it to our advantage. We need to expect more of these we place in charge, we need to make sure they are fully aware of their responsibilities and we need to make sure they are willing to live up to their commitment. At the same time we need to remove as many obstacles as possible, we need to be there to lend a helping hand, we need to be there in a supporting role, not in an "I told you so" role. In other words we need to work together for the benefit of our Particular Lodges and the Craft. We need to Possibly take a look at the newly elected or installed Masters in the District and have them meet with the District Deputies, MLT and Masonic Education Officers to conduct a small seminar just for the Masters that they may understand what is expected of them as described in the Digest of the Masonic Law of Florida and other Administrative guides. We need to eliminate that "deer in the headlights look" when they are approached two or three months later or 9 months later and they still look like they are surprised and constantly say they do not know. We need to determine once and for all whether they truly do not know or just do not care. Education will make the difference and as a Band of Brothers we need to step up in every District and have this seminar available for these Brothers who will be charged with leading us next year. Do not wait for someone else to do it, take charge, volunteer and if you need assistance, I'm here to help along with 300 plus Grand Lodge Appointees, Be a Leader, make it happen.

I ask the current Worshipful Masters to have an Officers meeting and there discuss the District Deputy Grand Master's Report with the Officers and devise a plan of attack for correcting the deficiencies. Do not leave it for someone else to start the ball rolling. Try to leave your Lodge in better shape than when you found it. It is your responsibility while you are still Worshipful Master, after all the report is of the conditions in which you are operating the Lodge. Share the information. Together you can make the difference and turn your Lodge around.

My Brothers, again there is no need for our Lodges to operate in such a state of disrepair by not following the requirement set by the Digest of the Masonic Law of Florida. We, as responsible men and Masons, need to step up to the challenge, and if you only knew how easy it would be to turn things around, you would not hesitate for one second to do it. Ask for help. We are here at your beck and call.

Some of you may get the "we have been doing it this way forever" answer. Well, my Brothers, just because you have been doing it wrong forever does not make it right. What it means is that you need to change your ways and start demonstrating that an old dog can learn new tricks and look at what is going to take to do it right and make plans to carry the mission to a successful outcome, Don't be the Brother that drags the Lodge down. by holding them back from the fulfillment of their obligations. Let's work together. Be a force for good, "be a builder".
